¹³And when they had entered, they went up to the upper room, where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot and Judas the son of James. ¹⁴All these with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers.

Letter to the Congregation

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus our Lord,

I am writing to you, a third time as we, the members of St Paul Blue Point, try to find ways to carry out our mission and ministry during this time of pandemic. We are writing to continue to inform you of the latest news, given the circumstances in our community/state. This letter will come to your mailbox, and will also be published on the church website www.stpaulbluepoint.org, and the church Facebook page. Regular

announcements will be published on our Facebook page and our webpage. Please be aware that the pastor and church depend on you to take the initiative to help schedule any visits, communion services, etc. Also pastor and the elders would like to thank all the members for their help in getting through this difficult time.

Therefore, after meeting with the elders on May 14th, and pastor meeting with the Circuit Visitors of the three districts of Illinois, (whose district presidents joined in sending a letter asking the Governor to allow the churches to gather), and then meeting with pastors from three of our local circuits, the pastor and elders of St Paul are going to recommend the following;

- 1.) That communion services will be offered in groups of 10 on Tuesday and Thursday evenings at 7 PM, and Sunday at 9:45 and 11 AM. Preregistration is required so that we can abide with the rules set forth by the state. (Regarding the Effingham and Fayette County meetings and recommendations about opening up their respective counties, these recommendations do not have legal standing that would allow us to open up church services, legal and civil liabilities are not avoided by any appeal to these documents). Please note, this will allow for 40 people a week to commune. Also please note that this will probably be the way we gather for service through June, at least as far as we can see at this moment. If we need more services, they will be offered as the need becomes apparent from your requests/appointment etc. Please do not wait for someone to call you, if you desire communion, but...
- 2.) The elders ask that the members of the congregation, as they consider their desire for communion, please contact Beth Speers via the church facebook site to schedule for communion. If that is not possible, please call or text Beth at 217-821-3507 or leave a message on the church phone 618-483-6993. (please do not call the pastor to schedule for these services, unless you want to schedule outside of these times, say on a weekday morning, afternoon etc). If a service time is filled, we will offer more services, on Saturday, as we did this past week. (the services grew from one to eight, serving 90 people). Scheduling will take place on a first come first served basis. Saturday services will begin at 1 PM and go through the afternoon at 1 hour 15 minute intervals.
- 3. Private communion and visits with the pastor continue to be available as needed and as can be scheduled. We encourage you to call the pastor if you have any needs and especially if you would like communion and have not been able to schedule a time. (Pastor's cell is 618-367-2697)
- 4. Sermons and bible studies will be available on the internet through the church's facebook page, the church's website, and through Zoom. If you are interested in participating in the Wednesday morning bible study speak to pastor. We will be doing a Zoom study on Sunday morning at 8:30-9:30 AM beginning May, 31st. Please contact pastor to be included.
- 5. Please continue to faithfully send your offerings to our financial secretary, Miles Kopplin, at Miles Kopplin 11260 N. 300th St Altamont, Illinois 62411

- 6. The church website, www.stpaulbluepoint.org will have resources such as recordings of sermons, bulletins, and calendars. Please be patient about this resource, as updating it is dependent on the schedule of the pastor. If he is busy, the website will be slow in being updated. The synod is also putting up many resources on its website www.lcms.org and so use this address to take advantage of them.
- 7. The elders will try to have calendars, financial reports, and a weekly bulletin in the mailbox of each member by Sunday afternoon. If there are other resources that you need, would like to have, please talk to the pastor.
- 8. Again, this will continue for some time...

Finally, pray for one another, as we walk together through this very difficult set of events. Pastor will be posting prayer requests as needed. As things change, the pastor will communicate with the congregation, primarily through weekly bulletins, announcements on our Facebook page (which is a public page and can be viewed even if you do not have a Facebook account), and the website. Letters like this will be more infrequent because of the cost of sending them. (about \$50 per mailing). If you know someone who does not have access to the internet, does not know how to use Facebook/websites etc, please help them, and if necessary ask the pastor for printouts of any written material and take it to that person. Perhaps play a sermon from Facebook or the website for them. Another letter will come out when new information becomes available. We hope that the process of opening Illinois proceeds quickly and we can gather again as Church. If you have any needs, please do not hesitate to call Pastor Speers at 618-367-2697.
