St Paul Ladies Aid—In thanksgiving for our congregation

For Advent 3: December 13, 2020

We've just come through fall election campaigns. How often did you see a candidate being asked a question, but then responding with a different answer? That kind of thing seems to happen a lot among those who are seeking office.

In a Bible passage to be read in our church service on Sunday, a delegation from Jerusalem approached John the Baptizer, the forerunner of Jesus, with a simple question: "Who are you?" (John 1:19).

After making clear who he was not, John answered the "WHO are you" question not by telling WHO he was, but WHAT. He said he was the voice: "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' as the prophet Isaiah said" (John 1:23)

John the Baptizer was not seeking an office. The Lord had already given him one. John was the forerunner of the Messiah, and he was carrying out his responsibilities. He would continue carrying them out later when he pointed to Jesus and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29), and when he said about Jesus, "He must increase, but I must decrease" (John 3:30).

Someone has said that a person goes wrong to regard himself or herself as a WHO and God as a WHAT. Then it becomes easy to think of God as some sort of crutch or a device for us to use.

Try it the other way around. Like John the Baptizer, think of God as a WHO, and yourself more as a WHAT.

Now, of course, you are a WHO too. Yet the God Who did not spare His Son but gave Him up for us all is the greatest WHO there is! Trust Him.
